



Online EMT Breakdown

The RC Health Services Online EMT Program consist of 3 portions: didactic, psychomotor, and clinical internship. Here is a brief overview of all portions:

Didactic Portion

The Didactic Portion of the course is completed online through the Jones and Bartlett Navigate Program at the student's pace. The student will complete interactive lectures, chapter quizzes, and other assignments for all 41 chapters. The included eBook is *Emergency Care and Transportation of the Sick and Injured 11th Edition*. Students will also have access to various supplementary material and RCHS-specific enhancements. Psychomotor Portion

This is the hands-on portion of the course. The Psychomotor Portion of the course is completed at RC Health Services Training Centers. Students will complete a Medical Skills Practice Day (for which they are eligible after Chapter 21), a Trauma Skills Practice Day (for which they are eligible after Chapter 31), and an NREMT Psychomotor Skills Testing Day (for which they are eligible after completing both practice days). These are scheduled in advance so students can arrange their schedules accordingly.

Clinical Internship

The Clinical Internship is one of the most unique experiences in EMS Education. Students will attend rotations at EMS and Hospital locations and get real-world, hands-on experience. Students will be required to attend **at least** 24 hours in an EMS setting and 12 hours in a Hospital setting. These are scheduled through RCHS at its affiliates.

Q: What are the system requirements?

Q: Is this program accredited?

A: The RC Health Services EMS Academy courses are approved through the Texas Department of State Health Services. The approval process for our programs are the same as any college, though we are not a college.

Q: Will I be eligible to sit for the NREMT exam after I successfully complete the course?

A: Yes!

Q: Will I have instructors to help me out?

A: Yes! You will be assigned an instructor at the start of your class.

Q: How long do I have to complete the course?

A: You must complete all aspects of the course, including clinical rotations, within 6 months of your start date.

Q: Do you accept financial aid?
